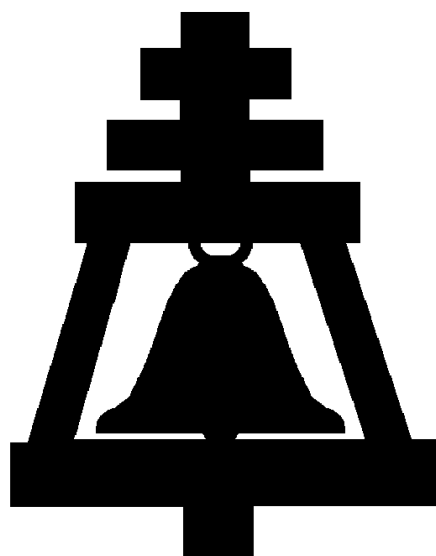

NOTE: Volumes 1, 2, and 3 were called Life-Line until we discovered that another society was already using that name for their quarterly. In Volume 4, the name was changed to Lifeline. Volume 1 had 5 issues, each starting with page 1; Volume 2 had 2 issues, each starting with page 1. Volume 3 had 4 issues, with continued numbering for all 4 issues.

Some articles or data were printed more than once.

I did NOT index queries, poems (well maybe a few!), genealogy general tips, computer software reviews, websites, book reviews, our MEMORANDUM of New Periodicals, News and Notes, and New Books On the Shelf. For Ahnentafels, Descendency Charts, Family Group Sheets, or Pedigree Charts there may be some listed, but not necessarily all. In the case of family information, members may no longer be members, have moved, or died. In some cases, I have indexed a topic under two different headings as they relate to both.

Volume 5, #3, mimeographed in blue, hard to read.

Volume 21, #1 has pages 1-37; #2 has pages 1-43; #3 has pages 87-131; #4 has pages 132-177

Volume 36, #2 and #3, 2000-2001, was marked, on my copy anyway, as Volume XXVI!

Volume 40 only has a #1 and a #2, as insufficient funds to print 4 issues.

There was no Volume 41 as we had no Editor.
